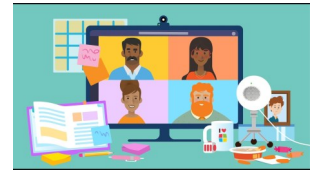

Dear all

We hope you are all well and continuing to look after yourselves. We are continuing to miss all pupils in school however acknowledge that it is important that we all do our part and make every effort to reduce the rates of transmission. You may have seen yesterday that Boris Johnson announced that schools could re-open as of March 8th however this not definitive as yet. Once we have more information about this, we will let you know.

We know this is not an easy time for many parents, juggling home learning and work commitments. We have many members of staff experiencing the same thing. I wanted to let you know that you are all doing an amazing job in supporting your children. The response we have had to remote learning has been phenomenal. We do hope you have found the increase in pre-recorded lessons helpful to guide your child with their work.



Some parents have mentioned to us that pupils are missing the social interaction with their peers and we are currently putting in place arrangements for these sessions to take place with class teachers. Prior to this taking place, we will be asking parents to agree to a home school agreement in order to keep everyone safe online.

Remote Learning Feedback

We have recently reviewed our practice for feedback whilst completing remote learning.

On a daily basis, we ask that all pieces of work are 'handed in' by 5pm. Feedback will be provided on each piece of work by lunchtime the following day. This will either be a typed comment or a voice recorded comment.

We know it may be difficult for some parents to support their child to upload the work by 5pm due to work commitments. Please don't worry about this. You can still upload after this time.



Access to devices

During the previous school closure, we received 23 Chromebooks through the Government scheme. We have also been able to loan 15 tablets from Castleford Heritage Trust.

Yesterday we received a visit from staff at the local distribution centre for TKMax, who donated 4 brand new laptops for the school to support remote learning. This was arranged by one of our parents. We are so grateful for this generosity, as it enables us to support an increasing number of families.
